Pa. FFA Members Visit State Capitol

About 450 Pennsylvania FFA members attended the annual State Legislative Leadership Conference on March 18-20. Members developed leadership and personal growth skills, practiced the legislative process, completed community service around the Harrisburg area, and finished with a legislative breakfast.

Students began the conference with workshops about etiquette, parliamentary procedure and learned how the legislative process works. The students applied those skills by taking part in the legislative process. Each student was assigned to the House of Representatives or the Senate, and then was given a committee and bill to discuss and amend. The bills used were actual bills currently going through committee in the Capitol.

Students spent time reviewing and amending the bills as if they were legislators. After the committee work, students met as a caucus to further adjust the bills, and finally approved each bill as a general assembly, mirroring the actual legislative process. The legislative process ended with each caucus approving each bill.

The students volunteered at more than a dozen sites in the Harrisburg area and logged more than 1,500 community service hours on March 19.

At Vibrant - A Christian Church, students cleaned the children's area and packed more than 5,000 Easter eggs and about 160 baskets for the upcoming Easter egg hunt. At a local fire hall, students cleaned equipment and fire trucks.

Following an afternoon of community service, students gathered on busses to travel to a local Hoss's Steak and Sea House for dinner. At each location, students had the chance to interact with other chapters or a state FFA officer. After returning to the hotel,

the student body attended a dance and graffiti party, taking the opportunity to socialize with other members and create mementos by signing each other's shirts.

A legislative breakfast wrapped up the conference. Members of the General Assembly were invited to join the Pennsylvania FFA membership for breakfast and a program held at the Radisson Hotel Harrisburg in Camp Hill. Legislators had the opportunity to visit with the local chapters they represent, while members were able to advocate for agriculture and FFA. Students also heard from special guests like Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture Russel Redding and Pennsylvania Farm Bureau President Rick Ebert. Other special guests in attendance included former Secretary of Agriculture Samuel Hayes, and former national FFA officers, Gary Swan and Victor Cappucci, Jr.

After the breakfast, several FFA chapters travelled to the capitol building to tour with their local legislators.

Members Shine at Chapter Banquets
