"We have to become involved," Hayes said.

Since the start of the program, thousands of students have come to Harrisburg as part of the SLLC. During Hayes' remarks to the group, he challenged them to take the opportunity to make a difference in the legislative process.

Matt Dodson, state FFA chaplain, said that during this past weekend FFA members re-created the legislative pro-

cess. Conference participants were sorted into their own version of the General Assembly, debating several agriculture issues that now stand before the state legislature.

Dodson said the experience brings parliamentary procedure to life. For members who enjoy the formalized decision-making process, it is a popular part of the conference. The issues tackled by the students included agricultural education. property rights and farmland preservation.
