compete at the Eastern States Exposition held Sept. 16 through Oct. 2 in Springfield, Mass.


First place individuals in each CDE received a plaque and \$100. In the Agriscience Fair, the first place winner in each category

received a plaque and \$100; the second place winner, a plaque and \$50; and the third place winner, a plaque and \$25.


