## Stock the Trailer at the Pa. Farm Show

The Pennsylvania FFA Alumni Association has partnered with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture to "Stock the Trailer" at the 2011 Farm Show.

On Monday, Jan. 10, trailers will be located at the Cameron Street entrance and in the Large Arena in hopes of filling them with donations to the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank. The Central Pennsylvania Food Bank distributes more than 15 million pounds of food and grocery products every year to soup kitchens, shelters, and food pantries in Central Pennsylvania.

Last year, Pennsylvania FFA members and friends donated 3,000 pounds of food to the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank. This year, the group are hoping to donate 8,000 pounds of food, which would represent nearly one pound of donated food product for each Pennsylvania FFA member.

## Safe Tractor Driving Course to Begin Feb. 1

The Danville FFA chapter, with the cooperation of the Montour Antique Farm Machinery Collector's Association (MAFMCA), will be sponsoring a National Safe Tractor and Machinery Operation Program. The program will begin on Feb. 1, 2011 at 5 p.m. at the Montour-Delong Fairgrounds in Washingtonville. The purpose of the course is to help 14-18 year old youth learn how to be safe while operating tractors and equipment on a farm, as well as recognize potential danger areas on the farm. Students do not need to be members of MAFMCA or the Danville Area School District to participate in the program. The program will consist of three evening meetings (2 hours each), a day for the written test and driving practice, and a day for driving tests.

The MAFMCA is co-sponsoring this course because many of the tractor show and pull organizations require an operator's certificate for youth under the age of 16 to partici-

pate in tractor pulls and parades. The National Safe Tractor and Machinery Operator's Certificate is also required by federal labor laws for a child under the age of 16 to be legally hired to do most types of farm work on a farm not owned by a parent - especially if they will be using a tractor over 20 horsepower or operate any other type of equipment. This course is strongly recommended for all middle and high school youth who spend time on any type of farm regardless of whether they operate machinery or not. Certificates to those who successfully complete the written and driving portions of the course will be issued at the first MAFMCA tractor pull of the year on April 30, 2011.

Registration is limited to the first 15 students who register for the course, and there is no fee to take the course.
