NEWPORT, Pa. — The, "Living to Serve, Learning to Grow," event hosted by the Perry County FFA Chapters, was held on May 20 at the Perry County Fairgrounds. This event was made possible thanks to a grant from the National FFA Organization and USDA which helped pay for busing, substitutes and supplies to make the event possible.

Members from the Greenwood,
Newport and West Perry FFA Chapters served as leaders and presenters for the third graders who attended.
The day was filled with nearly 500 thrid grade students from Greenwood, Newport, Susquenita, and West Perry

School Districts.

Workshop topics held for the students included recycling, soil, water, healthy eating, the growing process and gardening. Students were able to experience a hands on learning activity that reinforced the lesson at each station.

The third graders in attendance weren't the only students learning lessons.

Emily Griswold from the Greenwood FFA Chapter said, "Not only was I able to learn how to work with younger children, but I also enhanced my own knowledge of agriculture." Griswold said that her favorite part was seeing the excitement as children planted their own green bean seeds. "They were attentive, constantly smiling and asked numerous questions regarding the green beans and other vegetables."
