Mohawk FFA Prepares Square Dance Teams

BESSEMER, Pa. — Every year the Mohawk FFA Chapter takes a square dance team or two to the Pennsylvania State Farm Show to compete against several other square dance teams from around the state. It has been this way at Mohawk for the last 40 plus years.

Before 1969, when girls were not permitted to join FFA, the team consisted of Mohawk FFA male members and female members from the Future

Homemakers of America.

After girls were permitted into the FFA, the team or teams consisted of both Mohawk FFA female and male members. However, in the early stages female members had to be full-time agriculture students. Meaning that they had to take both a classroom and shop class. This caused female mem-

bership numbers to be low in the early 1970s. Nowadays, however, members can join by either participating in a shop, in a classroom, or in Ag Records to be in the club and participate on the square dance team.

For those 40 plus years, advisers, adviser's wives, or a local square dance caller, such as John McKim, taught the members of the team(s) how to square dance.

Two teams are competing from Mohawk this year, and Janet Wallace will be teaching both of the teams. FFA members include Brandon Aikman, Brandon Ball, Tyler Claypool, Scott Kastner, Kelli Fox, Cassie Musser, McKenzie Raney, and Autumn Piuri for the first team. The second team is Sam Arisman, Allison Ball, Samantha Clark, John Gallagher, Jessica Porchian, Megan Osburn, Matt Rimbey, and Alex Scott. Team members have

been working and practicing hard since early October and will be ready to compete at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show on Jan. 11. Other than the Farm Show, the members will also perform in nursing homes, Granges, and other community places. At the nursing homes, they dance and then talk with the residents. The residents of the nursing homes seem to enjoy watching the square dance team and talking with the members.

The team members and past members enjoy the team activity and learn how to work and communicate as a team. This helps them in the future with jobs and other activities they may pursue. Some former members still square dance after graduation and they continue to do so throughout their lives.
