Maple Industry Communication Skills

CDE Outline

CDE Component	Points	Component Description
Part 1 - Written Exam	50	Students will complete a 25-question multiple choice exam designed to assess their knowledge of the maple industry. Topics may include maple tree identification, sap collection methods, syrup production processes, grading standards, equipment use, safety practices, value-added maple products, etc. Questions will reflect both traditional and modern industry practices.
Part 2 - Tools, Equipment and Products	20	Students will identify 20 tools used in the maple industry.
Part 3 - Individual Skills Demonstrations	150	Students will be asked to demonstrate three hands-on skills related to maple production. The specific skills will be selected from a rotating list and are subject to change each year. • Grading Maple Syrup Samples (See Vermont Maple CDE page 21) • Proper Tapping Techniques • Determining the Sugar Content of Sap
Part 4 - Maple Industry Communication Skills	100	In this individual activity, students will demonstrate their ability to interact professionally with the public. Participants may be asked to role-play a scenario such as promoting or selling a maple product, answering customer questions, or explaining production practices to consumers. This activity is designed to assess communication skills, product knowledge, and the ability to represent the maple industry in a positive and informative manner.
Part 5 - Team Activity	300	Team members will collaborate to address a real-world scenario related to the maple industry. This may involve solving a problem, developing a new product, promoting an event or initiative, or presenting innovative ideas. Teams will prepare a solution and present it to a panel of judges. Possible scenario topics include, but are not limited to: • Marketing and Current Trends • New Product Development

- Nutrition and Health
- Sugarbush Management
- New and Emerging Technologies

The scenario topic will be provided to teams prior to the event to allow time for research and preparation. This activity is designed to develop students' critical thinking, communication, and teamwork skills while applying their knowledge of the maple industry.

Causes for Disqualification: Talking during the contest or found cheating.
